

## «IL PENSIERO ECONOMICO ITALIANO». CODE OF CONDUCT

«IL pensiero economico italiano» («PEI») aims at selecting and publishing high standard works in the field of the history of economic thought. The Editors and the Editorial Office are responsible for securing accurate and independent revision, based on *double-blind peer review*, of all manuscripts submitted. Adherence to the rules of this Code of Conduct is requested of all those involved in the process of selection, revision and publication.

### PAPERS SELECTIONS AND PUBLICATION

Decision and responsibility for publishing or rejecting each manuscript submitted to «PEI» rests entirely with the Editors and the Editorial Office. They are responsible for ensuring double blind peer review by at least two referees selected from the list of referees of all manuscripts, exception being made for manuscripts that have been rejected by the Editorial Office as manifestly inadequate and/or unrelated to the history of economic thought.

No information on manuscripts will be given to persons other than the Editors, the Scientific Committee, the authors and the reviewers. Unless explicit consensus be given by all the authors of a paper submitted, all involved in the process of selection and publication will refrain from any use of the unpublished contents, be it for personal or scientific purposes.

Articles are published in conformity with the law. No work will be published which is defamatory and/or not in conformity with copyright laws.

If any issue be raised with regard to copyright, conflicts of interest, or evident inaccuracies in articles published in «PEI», the Editorial Office will give immediate communication to the Editors and the Publisher. All necessary actions will be taken in order to decide whether the problem actually exists. If necessary, the article will be withdrawn and/or a retraction/clarification will be published.

### RESPONSIBILITIES OF REFEREES

Referees provide assistance to the Editorial Office in the process of selection and publication of the manuscripts.

On receiving a manuscript for revision, the referee will promptly communicate to the Editorial Office her/his decision as to whether to accept or not to be a referee for the manuscript.

A referee who does not consider her/himself qualified to review a manuscript, or for any reason is not able to revise the manuscript within the set deadline, must immediately communicate her/his refusal to the Editorial Office. Refusal is mandatory in cases of conflict of interest.

Manuscripts must be considered as private and confidential. If explicit permission is not given by the Editorial Office, reviewers shall abstain from discussing a manuscript with other persons, nor shall s/he divulge any information it contains.

Revision must be based on scientific and objective criteria. Comments on the text must be supported by clear and documented arguments.

### *«Il pensiero economico italiano». Code of Conduct*

It is a duty of the referees to suggest how to improve a manuscript. Suggestions must be communicated to the Editorial Office and then passed on to the author(s). In particular, referees must point out any published contribution which is relevant and that has not been taken into consideration by the author(s).

When a referee detects a plagiarism or any similarity between a manuscript and some published material, this must be immediately communicated to the Editorial Office.

#### RESPONSIBILITIES OF AUTHORS

Authors will not submit to «PEI» a manuscript that has already been published in other journals, or which is currently submitted to another journal.

Authors must ensure that their work is original. They are also expected to provide the due references to the published materials they employed in their work. All publications that have in some way influenced the preparation of the manuscript must be cited in the text. Authors of researches based on unpublished material will give all the information that is needed in order to locate and compare the material.

The names of all who gave a direct and significant contribution to the drafting of the text must be mentioned as co-authors.

In preparing their manuscript, authors will avoid mentioning any detail which could reveal their identity to the referees.

In cases of co-authored manuscripts, the Editorial Office will keep in contact with one, and only one, of the authors. This author will take full responsibility for any communication on behalf of the others. S/he shall guarantee that the submitted version was accepted by all co-authors, and that all authors agreed to submit exactly this version of the manuscript to «PEI».

To ensure a correct selection and revision process, any potential conflict of interest must be indicated in the text at the moment of submission. All sources of funding must also be indicated.

Authors must promptly communicate to the Editorial Office any mistake or inaccuracy contained in a manuscript submitted for publication in «PEI» or already published in «PEI».
